## Winchester Restaurants & Pubs

Winchester has many good restaurants. Many are located on the main High Street, just off the High street, or in Jewry Street, which can be found at the top of the High Street. Please see below for a list of recommended places to go, but feel free to try others. You can walk from the conference venue to any of these in a matter of a few minutes.

Also note that if it is sunny, at lunch time many people buy a picnic from a café or shop (e.g. Pret a Manger, or Marks & Spencers, both on the High Street), and eat it on the grass in front of the Cathedral.

## On/just off High Street:

Cote Brasserie, 73 High Street. Wide ranging menu, with vaguely French theme.

Zízzí, 57 High Street. Pízza, pasta, some other Italian dishes.

Ask, 101 High Street. Mainly pizza & pasta.

Ivy Brasserie. 103-104 High Street. High end brasserie.

Rick Stein, 7 High Street. High end fish restaurant.

The Bishop on the Bridge, 1 High Street. Pub with a wide ranging food menu, virtually right next to the conference venue.

Gandhí restaurant, 163-164 High Street. Traditional (British!) Indian restaurant.

Palm Pan Asia restaurant, 166-167 High Street. A mixture of many Asian influences.

The Winchester Stable, 31b The Square. Pizza and pies.

Forte Kitchen, 78 Parchment Street. Good café, open for lunch, not dinner.

Manov Thai, 72-74 St. Georges Street. Thai restaurant.

River Cottage Kitchen, Abbey Mill Gardens. Fairly high end restaurant, British food.

Café Monde, 22 The Square. Good café for lunches for small groups.

## On Jewry Street:

Mr So, 3 Jewry Street. Chinese restaurant.

Dím-T, 8-9 Jewry Street. Large restaurant with a mixture of Asian cuisines.

Sakura, 32 Jewry Street. Below ground level Japanese restaurant.

Loch Fyne, 18 Jewry Street. Fish restaurant.

Brasserie Blanc, 19/20 Jewry Street. High end French-style restaurant.

Wagamama, Century House, Jewry Street. Noodle restaurant. Good for larger groups.
